


Here it is. The Ugly, Chopped K82G. Some of the items to notice





NOTE that stock fore end is no more than 2in wide ... Do this first, it makes the other cuts (fore end tip and bottom) much easier

K82G SILHOUETTE

REMOVE THE RAIL

Don't forget to remove trigger guard & washer when you make the bottom cut

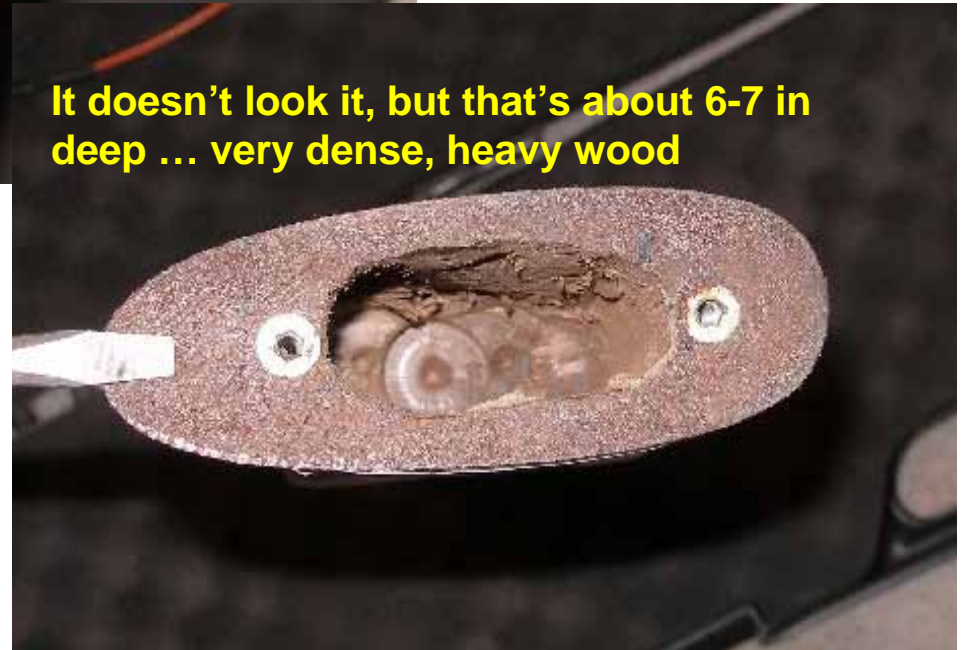


Yeah, it's ugly, but too bad It still shoots!



IG SILHOUETTE

It doesn't look it, but that's about 6-7 in deep ... very dense, heavy wood



10lbs-2oz is the limit, so there is a bit of play for a different scope.

You may have to choose the scope & rings w/ some care. These are Bushnell "High" see-thru .22 rings (Walmart I think...) and a BSA 36x44 "Platinum" scope
