- EQUIPMENT CLASSES:** **PRECISION and SPORTER**
Separate categories for competition. Participants may compete in only one category.
- COMPETITION OPEN TO:** Individuals: Open to all high school or school age competitors.
Teams: **Only SCHOLASTIC & CLUB teams are allowed.**
- RULES:** Current **2010-2012** National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules will apply.
- AWARDS:** 1st thru 3rd team trophies for each category, i.e., Precision and Sporter
Individual Medals --- Sporter (1-5) Precision (1-3)
Individual Position Medals (P-S-K) --- Sporter (1-5) Precision (1-3)
- RANGE:** Take I-40 West to **Coors**. Go south on **Coors Blvd**.
Turn Right on **GlenRio Rd NW**. (Before the walkway overpass)
Continue W on **GlenRio** to the Aux Gym parking lot
- ENTRY FEES:** Team: \$40.00 **Cash or Check ONLY - No Purchase Orders**
Individual: \$10.00 Payable at time of registration
- TARGETS:** ORION & VIS Targets will be used in this Cup Match.
- CHALLENGES:** Challenges will be in accordance with current rulebook

ACCOMODATIONS: Numerous hotels are in the immediate area. This is also a New Mexico Activity Association sanctioned event. Accordingly motel discounts are available by going to NMAA.org.

OTHER:

1. Only Cash & Check are acceptable means of match payment (NO PURCHASE ORDERS)
2. Anticipate **50** firing points per relay. Each club/school/JROTC unit, etc., entering teams are initially guaranteed entry of two teams (1 Prec & 1 Sporter). Thereafter, entry will be on a space available, first come, first serve basis. Receipt of entry fees is required to validate entry and relays. On October 31, 2011 entries are unrestricted.

3. Due to space and safety considerations, only Shooters and 1 coach per firing team will be allowed in the range. We are shooting 2 directions (50 points). ALL OTHERS must remain outside the range in the staging area.

4. **NJROTC Instructors** must remain in the range area while their shooters are on the firing line.
5. **CMP Individual ID #'s**. This is a CMP Cup Match and EIC points may be earned. Participants should ensure they have registered with the CMP and received CMP ID number. *Note: These numbers can be generated when the roster is received and at the match if necessary.*
6. Be at the range a **minimum of one (1) hour prior** to relay time.
Remember, preparation time begins 10 minutes prior to relay "START" time.
7. CO² and compressed air refill tanks available.
Individuals and teams are responsible for their own air tank adapters.
Only Daisy Avanti 888/887 standard fill station/adaptor will be on the CO2 tank.
CROSSMAN and AIR ARMS Adapters are NOT available ... make sure you bring yours.
8. Shooters requesting Relay #4 on Day 3 are requested to stay and help tear down the range after the Final.
9. Rule 10.1.6 will be invoked to fire a FINAL at the conclusion of each competition day.

MATCH DIRECTOR BULLETIN #1 – ORION SCORING & SCORING PROTESTS

Rule 8.4 – Electronically Scored Targets is in force for the Duke City Cup

Protest Fee: **none**

Protest Loss Penalty: **2 points** (*required in a sanctioned match*)

Notes on the ORION scoring process:

The National Three-Position Air Rifle Council and USA Shooting rules allow competitors to protest (or challenge) the value of a shot scored by Orion. During a protest Orion uses a more complex and time intensive algorithm to determine the location of a shot. To conduct a protest follow the procedure below.

1. Competitors shoot a series of targets that are turned in to the statistical officer.
2. The statistical officer scans the targets, loads them into Orion, assigns the targets to the appropriate competitor, and scores the target using Orion.
3. During a review process the statistical officer may correct “obvious” errors made by Orion. An example of an obvious error is a shot hole that was not found by Orion. Conversely the statistical officer may not decide that a shot scored by Orion as a 9.9 is really a 10.0. During the review process the statistical officer should assign the “Extra Shot” attribute to any extra shot on the 10 bull target.
4. The statistical officer posts the results. These results are considered final unless protested by the competitor (or coach).
5. During the challenge period a competitor may protest the value of an individual shot. The competitor must clearly indicate which shot(s) he or she is protesting.
6. The statistical officer or scorer, from within Orion on the scoring tab, finds the target that has the protested shot. If there is an obvious error (the shot was not found by Orion) the statistical officer may make a manual correction and return the protest fee to the competitor.
7. If the error is not obvious, the statistical officer then selects the shot (the shot turns from blue to red), right clicks on the shot, and selects Protest Shot.” The Protest Shot option will run a more comprehensive scoring algorithm on that individual shot.
8. After a few seconds Orion will return with the results, either a Protest Won (the shot value went up) or Protest Lost (the shot value remains the same) message.
- 9. Competitions sanctioned under the National Three-Position Air Rifle Council must penalize the shooter with a 2 point penalty for each lost protest.**

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MATCH DIRECTOR BULLETIN #2 – Breaking Ties under Rule 10.1.6

The 2011 Duke City Cup is operating under Rule 10.1.6 – Multiple Finals for Multi-Day Events.

Shootoffs for FINALS slots are not possible with competitors firing finals on separate days, thus the FINALS slots will be won as follows:

- A) If there is a tie for the daily top 8 FINALS slot(s), ties will be broken IAW Rule 8.6.1
- B) ONLY the top 8 3x20 qualifying scores for sporter and precision categories are used to determine which shooters FINAL targets are used for the aggregate match scores.
- C) If there is a tie in the overall match qualifying 3x20 scores, Rule 8.6.1 will be used to break the tie(s).

MATCH DIRECTOR BULLETIN #3 – Coaching shooters on the line

Rule 5.2 - Coaching.

While on the firing line, during record shots, a competitor may only communicate with a Range Officer or Jury Member.

Sporter coaches are reminded that they are to conform to rule 5.2.1

Rule 7.19.4 will be strictly enforced.

Any person who appears to be communicating (**verbally or non-verbally**) with an athlete during match competition will receive a warning (along with the athlete). Continued violation will result in the person being asked to leave the range by the Match Director. A person so removed may not return to the range without the permission of the Match Director. In addition the athlete will receive a 2 point deduction for each occurrence after the warning. Coaches may communicate with sporter shooters on the line only during the preparation period before they fire their 1st record shot.

A coach may speak with a team member during the competition by FIRST obtaining permission from the Range Officer. The Range Officer will notify the competitor who must leave his rifle grounded on the firing line with the action open and a CBI inserted and leave the firing line to speak with the coach. Similarly, a shooter may speak with a coach during the competition by FIRST obtaining permission from the Range Officer to leave the firing line. The Range Officer will check that the rifle is grounded on the firing line with the action open and a CBI inserted and leave the firing line to speak with the coach. No extra time will be allowed for off-line coaching. Any approved communications with the athlete must be behind a line determined by the area to the rear of the Range Officer table(s).
